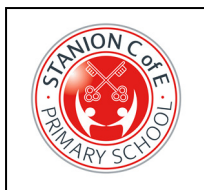


Sport Premium Case Study



Encouraging girls participation in sports clubs

Background

Stanion C.E Primary school is in the Corby, Oundle and Thrapston School Sport Partnership.

Girls participation in sports clubs was deemed to be poor with 13.3 % of girls at KS2 participating in extra-curricular sports clubs according to data collected in school in September 2014

The school decided to address as a priority by developing the quantity and variety of provision.

Actions

The school used its new Sports Crew to develop a questionnaire to establish what the girls would like to take part in.

The Sports Crew carried out the survey and came up with a list of possible sports.

Funding was released to pay for outside sports coaches to run these clubs, through the PE Premium

School Action Plan stated a member of staff per term was also to run a sports club

Quote – Headteacher

It is important for all of our children to be active and to participate in a wide range of sporting activities. By giving the children a voice and letting them choose what sports they would like to take part in, we found that numbers increased significantly and the children were actively engaged. It was a tremendous success and we are still benefitting from this a year on.

Impact

By the end of the academic year, Girls uptake was 86.2%, an improvement of over 70%

Fencing, netball, football, golf and athletics clubs were established and proved popular with the girls

These clubs are now a regular fixture at the school and are still popular

Quote – Pupil(s) “It is good that we have access to range of different sports as it helps us to keep fit and have fun. I’ve enjoyed the opportunity to have a club at breaktimes which does different type of sport. I like it that we can suggest what we would like to do the next week. Doing a variety helps us find out what we enjoy and are good at” Year 6 Girl.

How partners are supporting the school/cluster of schools to embed and sustain the activity

Locally, the School Sport Partnership supported the school to identify local clubs and coaches. The SSP has a Sport Premium Officer who works with the school to make sure they are fully utilising the Premium to have the biggest impact in the school.
