Warning signs of radicalisation over the internet - From Northamptonshire Police

- Change of appearance, wearing clothing that shows afflation to a group(Arabic dress AQ inspired or Stone Island Right Wing)
- Graffiti symbols, writing or artwork promoting extremist messages or images.
- Accessing extremist material online, including through networking sites (eg. Facebook, YouTube).
- Following known Jihadists on Twitter, Facebook and other social media
- Parental reports of change in behaviour, friendships or actions and requests for support.
- Voicing opinions drawn from extremist ideology or narrative
- Use of extremist or hate terms to exclude others or incite violence
- Racist language and targeting certain groups or individuals
- Recent conversion and following a conservative strand of the faith
- Mixing with known extremists
- Attending extremist meeting or marches

Early warning signs may or may not indicate a serious problem - they do not necessarily mean that a child is prone to violence towards themselves or others.
