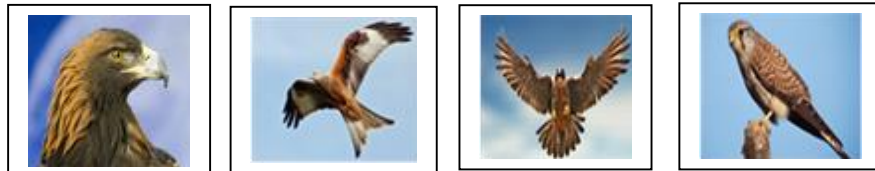

Reception Class

This week we have used the non-fiction book 'Egg to Chicken' and the story 'The Little Red Hen' as a basis for our literacy, science and creative activities. We have been finding out about the life cycle of a chicken as we patiently wait for our chicks to hatch.

We continue to do lots of counting from 20 and to numbers beyond 20, counting in 10's to 100, 5's to 100 and in 2's to 20. This week we have been using number lines to practice our addition and subtraction.

In phonics we have learnt the sounds 'ew' (chew the stew) and ire (fire, fire).

In R.E. we have started to find out about Weddings (listening to the story 'The Scarecrow's Wedding') as we prepare to have our class wedding.

Year 1/2

This week in Falcon class we have been learning about the Lighthouse Keepers' lunch and describing a setting in our literacy lessons. In maths we have been measuring and learning how to use a ruler accurately. In P.E we have been developing throwing and catching skills and using them in team games. Over half term the children have made some lovely lighthouses. We look forward to learning more about the lighthouse keeper's lunch and beginning to create our own stories next week. Year 3/4

In Red Kite this week we have been looking at newspaper reports; reading articles and identifying the features used. We have written some fantastic headlines; using puns, wordplay and alliteration to grab the readers' attention. In maths we have been investigating properties of shape and have created our own glossary. In RE we have been looking at where God is found in a world with suffering, and how religious people try to show God's love to others. The children have created some very thoughtful pieces of art to show where they think God is found in the world. In our geography topic we have been looking at how mountains are formed and have recreated the movement of tectonic plates.

Year 5/6

This week in Golden Eagle class we have been working very hard. In Maths we have been consolidating our knowledge of addition and subtraction written methods as well as using this to work out missing numbers in calculations. In Literacy we have been looking at writing persuasive texts and the children have been writing holiday brochures to persuade readers to travel to their hotel. We have also started to look at a video narrative of 'The Lighthouse' which the children will be writing about next week. In Science the children have continued with our work on variation and evolution. They have looked at the role of fossils as well as discussing natural selection. In RE we have continued with our work on Creation and Science. The children have studied and discussed different images and what they may represent as well as discuss how scientists, who are also Christians, interpret Creation.
