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<b>Primary PE and Sports Premium</b>	
<b>Aims</b>	1) To continue to embed Physical Education within the school, giving the children the opportunity to develop, practice and explore new skills in PE activities.
	2) To continue to increase teachers' confidence in delivering PE lessons with a specialist sports coach and to provide opportunities for staff to work alongside sports-specific coaches. To ensure new staff are familiar with the curriculum for PE, the format in which we teach it and the resources available.
	3) To provide school staff with access to courses and information to continue to develop PE at Stanion CofE Primary School in line with the National PE, Sport and Health initiatives.
	4) To provide the children with opportunities to experience competitive situations. These give them opportunities to work as a team, be proud to represent their school or house team, to appreciate hard work to abide by rules and support each other in victory and loss. This will include providing assistance with transport and appropriate kit where necessary.
	5) To provide all the children with opportunities to be physically active at break times, with access to equipment.
	6) To provide year-round extra-curricular clubs.
	7) To give the pupils the opportunity to develop leadership skills through participation in a Sports Crew. The pupils will work with peers and younger children to lead weekly playtime activities, host a series of Level 1 intra-school sports competitions and termly health focuses.
	8) To provide all KS2 children with a half term of extended swimming time whilst in each of the years 3/4/5/6. This will help to promote further skills, understanding of water safety and a higher percentage of children leaving KS2 at the National Curriculum level for swimming.
	9) To increase opportunity for the children to access and enjoy OAA activities which cannot be accessed within the school grounds to ensure challenge and excitement throughout a variety of curriculum areas.

	<b>Swimming</b> – all KS2 children to have the opportunity to access a half term of swimming each year with the enhanced lesson time of 1 hour.	£250	Quality club links continued to be developed with Corby pool; of which many children currently attend for lessons extra circularly. A higher percentage of children will be awarded the National Curriculum level for swimming and also have greater understanding of water safety.
	<b>Dance Workshop-</b> Dance workshop company to come in and provide dedicated sessions to the children.	£400	Dance teachers to work with children to provide specialised coaching. Could inspire out of school uptake in dance.
