Class News









Reception Class - (Kestrel)

For the past two weeks we have been following a topic on stories with repeating rhymes. Last week we used the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' as a basis for our literacy and creative activities. We really enjoyed acting out and retelling the story with lots of actions. This week we used the story 'Little Rabbit Foo Foo' by Michael Rosen as a basis for our literacy and creative activities.

We have been playing lots of games that practice our counting, ordering and recognition of numbers. This week we have used all sorts of resources to make symmetrical and repeating patterns.

Last week we learnt the sounds 's', 'a', 't' and 'p', and this week we have learnt 'i', 'n', 'm' and 'd'. We're really enjoying learning to read and make cvc words using the sounds we have learnt so far. We have also been practicing writing these letters and our names. For our science last week we drew around some people and labelled as many parts of their body as we could. We also looked at pictures of different baby animals and matched them to their parents.

In R.E. last week we thought about what makes us the same and what makes us different. We thought about the different groups we belong to including our school and church family. This week we have been looking at the different signs and symbols that show us our school belongs to the church family.

Last week we were very lucky to have a visit from Sophie from 'The Life Education Team'. We talked about our bodies and what we need to do to keep them fit and healthy. This week we took part in a range of activities organised by Revd Heather Lowe based around the theme of well-being.

Year 1/2 - (Falcon)

Year 1 and 2 have been working extremely hard and have been covering:

- Learning how to group and compare numbers in Maths, Year 1 have been focusing
 on numbers to 10 and how they can be represented. We have then looked at the
 location of numbers on a number line and how we can use number lines. We will be
 moving on to identifying parts of a whole and linking this to addition. Year 2 have
 been representing numbers to 100 and identifying the number of tens and the
 number of ones. They have been learning how to partition numbers in different
 ways.
- Learning how to write a description of a setting and linking this to our next unit retelling the Three Little Pigs. We have been exploring the features of a fairy tale and identifying those within different versions of the Three Little Pigs.
- Learning about the 99 names of Allah and what they mean to Muslims.
- Continuing our work on pitch and tempo in music.
- Enjoying a visit by Revd Heather with some wellbeing activities.
- Working on our ball skills in PE.
- Learning about life in the 1960s and why the moon landings were important in history.
- Working on games that will improve our mouse skills in Computing.

Year 3/4 - (Red Kite)

This week in Red Kite class we have been writing haiku and Tanka poems in our literacy work. We have been learning about syllables, alliteration, personification and similes. The children applied this knowledge to write a poem based on a specific theme. Our haikus were about areas around our school and we then created a Tanka poem about one of the four seasons.

In maths, we have been continuing our work on place value. The children have been partitioning 3 and 4-digit numbers and showing our understanding of thousands, hundred, tens and ones. In Year 4 the children we have been ordering and comparing numbers to demonstrate our understanding.

In history this week we have been learning about hieroglyphics and how Ancient Egyptians used these to communicate. We discovered that Egyptians were using these around the same time Stone Henge was build suggesting that they were more advanced at the time. This week we were also lucky enough to have some fantastic well-being sessions delivered by Heather and the ethos committee. The children enjoyed a range of activities that helped them with their own mental well-being.

Year 5/6 - (Golden Eagle)

In Golden Eagle class the children have all been working incredibly hard over the last couple of weeks. We have finished our work on place value and the number system in Maths and I have been so impressed with the children's knowledge of larger numbers and our work around them. They were so impressive with their knowledge of Roman Numerals. In Literacy, we have begun our new unit of work in which we are writing based around the book 'The man who walked between the towers'. The children have all been so engaged with this text and have enjoyed giving advice to the main character and developing their knowledge of modal verbs and pronouns to avoid repetition. In Science we have continued our unit of work on Electricity and we have been investigating the effect of adding different components into an electrical circuit. The children have been learning how to write up scientific experiments. On Tuesday, the children enjoyed taking part in the work which Reverend Heather prepared for us based around well-being. We look forward to continuing this work around the theme of well-being next week with the Ethos committee. On Wednesday, we enjoyed welcoming Helen and Alison from NSPCC to lead a workshop into how the children can 'Speak out to stay safe'. I know everyone found this very informative and really enjoyed taking part - I was incredibly impressed by the children's attitudes and how sensible and respectful they are. I feel like the children have all settled so well into life in Y5/6 now and have all demonstrated fantastic attitudes to learning over the last week!
