**Class News** 









Last week we continued our topic on Traditional Tales using the story 'The Three Little Pigs', as the basis for our literacy, science and creative activities.

This week we have used the story 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' as a basis for our literacy, science and creative activities. We have put lots of our writing and creative work together to make a display in the hall.

In maths last week we were thinking about addition, writing and working out addition problems using various objects. This week we have been comparing lengths. We have also been practicing our counting, ordering and recognition of numbers up to 20 and beyond. Last week we learnt the sounds 'sh', 'th', 'ng' and 'nk', and this week we have learnt 'ai', 'ee', 'igh' and 'oa'. We're getting really good at using our phonic knowledge to read and write sentences.

For our science last week we compared the materials the three little pigs used to make their houses. We thought about why the different materials were not good to build houses and

why bricks were the best. This week we made porridge, looking at the changes that take place when oats and milk are combined, and then cooked.

In R.E. we continue to explore the Understanding Christianity topic of 'Incarnation', Why do Christians perform Nativity plays at Christmas? Last week we were thinking about how Christians prepare for Christmas and how we can prepare for Christmas in our class. This week we will be acting out the story of when Jesus was a small boy and went to the temple with his parents. We will also be continuing with our Nativity boxes.

This week we started to practice our Nativity play 'Christmas Counts'. We really hope you will be able to join us on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> or Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> December for one of the performances.

#### Year 1/2 - (Falcon)

This week, in Year 1 and 2, we have been working super hard and have enjoyed:

- Enjoying starting our nativity rehearsal and learning our songs.
- Finishing our work on addition and subtraction and applying our strategies to solve problems.
- Beginning to explore multiplication using the language of groups of.
- Exploring the features of instructions and learning to write some of the sections in instructions using adverbials and conjunctions to add detail.
- Discussing how we should look after our world and what Christians do to show their belief that God created the world.
- Listening to Vivaldi's Autumn music and composing our own songs that include contrast.
- Learning how to draw shapes and use text boxes in computing.

# Year 3/4 - (Red Kite)

This week in Red Kite class we have been preparing to write an instruction text. We studied the features of this text type before learning and applying the language skills. The children worked hard to use expanded noun phrases, time adverbs and imperative verbs. They particularly enjoyed planning command sentences to direct people to a hidden water bottle and to direct some children safely to the toilet. In Maths, we have been finishing our unit of addition and subtraction in Year 3, learning how to estimate, check answers and solve problems. In Year 4 we have begun our multiplication and division unit. We have focused on the 3, 6 and 9 times tables trying to make links between them and learning to make links between multiplication facts and division facts.

In our history lesson this week we were learning about how the Ancient Greeks were impacted by the Persian invasion. We thought about the cause and consequences of the different stages of the invasion. During our RE this week we thought about the Jewish festival of Passover. We listened to the story of Moses and watched a short clip from the film The Prince of Egypt to think about how Moses was feeling. We then used drama to create a freeze frame of the part of the story that we thought was the most important to Jewish people. Many believed God talking to Moses was the most important as it made Moses believe and begin to make a change. Other believe it to be the part where the people paint Lamb's blood above their doors to thank God for passing over them. Finally, in PE this week we have been developing our ability to jump and hop for distance, whilst developing control on the landing. The children used their thigh muscles to generate power and their arms to build momentum before landing with soft knees for balance.

#### Year 5/6 - (Golden Eagle)

The children in Golden Eagle class have been really busy again over the last couple of weeks. In Literacy, we have continued to explore our text 'Leila and the Blue Fox'. We have enjoyed finding out more about the characters and their stories and have produced a variety of pieces of writing linked to this. Our Maths lessons have continued to focus upon fractions. We have looked at ordering and comparing fractions as well as how to convert between mixed numbers and improper fractions. I have been really impressed by the children's times table knowledge and this has helped them greatly within their work. In Science we have enjoyed investigating air and water resistance and finding out what these forces are. Our history lessons have continued to compare Mayan times to Anglo Saxon times and the children have been finding out how day to day life and ways of living were both similar and different. In computing the children have continued to enjoy making their websites using the Edublogs site and have been using some really complex computing skills to do so. We have been enjoying some team building and yoga during our PE sessions and I have enjoyed seeing the children work together and persevere with the skills we have been learning. Another great couple of weeks with lots of hard work!
