

## **Reception Class - (Kestrel)**

Please visit our Tapestry pages to see all the wonderful work we have been doing in Reception Class.

We have throughly enjoyed our work today with Mrs Ettridge linked to the Chinese New Year. We have been busy making our very own pigs or dogs linked to the year of our birth. Also, we have been thinking about the year of the dragon and have been writing some wonderful sentences. Mr Jones was so impressed with our beautiful handwriting!

We look forward to seeing all our parents next week for Parent Consultations on Tuesday and Thursday.

#### Year 1/2 - (Falcon)

In Year 1 and 2, we have been working super hard and enjoying:

- Reading the story of Leo and the Octopus. We have been exploring how we are all
  unique and how our emotions can be unique as well. We have then written some
  advice for Leo to help him regulate his emotions.
- Learning about different notations of money and identifying the coins and notes. Calculating with money and comparing amounts.
- Finding out about how Muslims pray and what the 5 Pillars of Islam are.
- Collecting data on the class's favourite animals and making pictograms and bar charts on the computers to present our data.
- Continuing to clap and play rhythms on percussion instruments in music.
- Exploring aerial maps and the symbols we can use to make a weather forecast.
- Celebrating Children's Mental Health week by exploring our 4 areas of well-being:
   Feel, Connect, Do and Learn.

#### Year 3/4 - (Red Kite)

This week in Red Kite we have been learning all about fractions in our maths lessons. We have been thinking about counting in fractions and learning how to convert mixed number fractions into improper fractions and vice versa. In our Literacy we have been writing text based on our book Varmints. The children have practiced using adverbials in our writing and then used a range of sentence types to create a poster asking people to look after nature.

In Science, we have been planning our experiment based around evaporation. We learnt all about the water cycle and all the stages. We then planned an experiment to find out the best way to dry clothes. In our Geography, we have been learning about plate tectonics and where the plates are located.

The children have been working hard this week and are looking forward to our final week before half term.

#### Year 5/6 - (Golden Eagle)

In Golden Eagle class the children have continued to work extremely hard in all subjects and have had a good couple of weeks. We have been enjoying our Literacy unit in which we have been building evidence to support our discussion text of if the beast should be sentenced for kidnapping in Beauty and Beast. The children have worked hard on collecting emotive language and reasons to support any arguments made. In Maths we have been looking at ratio and proportion and the children have been amazing at seeing the additive and multiplicative relationships between the numbers to work out the answers to the problems set to them.

In our Science lessons we have continued to think about classification and the children have enjoyed learning about microorganisms. We have thought about how to classify them as well as investigating how we know that yeast is a living thing.

In our RE lessons, we have continued to think about the Islamic faith and the children have been researching and writing up their understanding of what the Hajj is and why it is so significant to Muslims. In Geography we have continued to think about the Western USA and have looked at the economic activity of some of the different states within this region. We have also thought about the core concept of the water cycle and looked at the various stages of this.

Our Spanish lessons have continued to look at the Olympic Games and we have built our knowledge of how to say the different sports and professions. I have been really impressed with the children's hard work!
