**Class News** 









#### **Reception Class - (Kestrel)**

For the past two weeks we have continued with our topic on Dinosaurs, we are loving seeing all the dinosaurs the children are bringing in from home. Last week we used the stories 'The Dirty Great Dinosaur' by Martin Waddell 'Harry and his Bucketful of Dinosaurs'

by Ian Whybrow as the basis for our literacy work. We have been busy building junk model dinosaurs, which we cannot wait to show off in our assembly next Thursday.

In maths we have been practicing our adding and subtracting, and this week we have started to use number lines to solve addition problems. We also continue to practice our counting, ordering and recognition of numbers up to and beyond 20, counting in 2's and 10's.

In phonics we continue to review all the Phase 2 and 3 sounds we have learnt so far. For our science last week, we made an erupting volcano. This week we took part in the NFU's live session about how farmers look after their animals.

In R.E. we are now following the Understanding Christianity topic on Salvation, thinking about the signs and symbols associated with Easter. Last week we looked around the school to find different crosses and thought about why they are there. We also tried hot cross buns and found out why they have crosses on them. This week we have created Easter gardens to remind us of the different parts of the Easter story, and we have thought about why eggs are a symbol of new life.

We have been lucky to have lots of other exciting activities over the last two weeks. Last Tuesday 'West End in Schools' taught us how to do a dance based on the story 'Alice in Wonderland'. And on Thursday we dressed up to celebrate 'World Book Day'. We are looking forward to doing our class assembly on **THURSDAY 21**st **MARCH** at 2.45, we hope you can all join us.

#### Year 1/2 - (Falcon)

We are all looking forward to our class assembly on Friday afternoon, we hope you enjoy it! In Year 1 and 2, this week, we have been working hard and have enjoyed:

- Reading more of our books, The Pencil, and George's Marvellous Medicine.
- Using the BBC website to research and answer questions on famous historical people and events, in Computing.
- Learning how to use simple code blocks, in Computing.
- Working on our balance skills in Gymnastics.
- Learning about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Working on describing them and sorting them.
- Writing our own descriptions of monsters based around the book Billy and the Beast in Literacy.
- Learning about the hot and cold areas of the globe in Geography as well as finding the equator and the North and South Poles.
- Our live lesson from the farm for science week.

#### Year 3/4 - (Red Kite)

This week in Red Kite class, we have been continuing our work on decimals in our maths learning in Year 4. We have learnt to add decimals to make a whole, round decimals to the nearest whole number and identify fractions as decimals. In Year 3 we have been working on written methods for multiplication and the children have really impressed me with their understanding.

In Literacy, we have started our new book, the Tin Forest. We have created a poster asking people to look after the environment. The children used a range of sentence types to do this. We then thought about using conjunctions when making inferences about the text.

In our RE learning, we have been thinking about how Easter is celebrated around the world. We looked at different traditions in France, Spain, Sweden and Greece. We used this information to create a poster. In our Spanish learning, we have been learning ingredients transactional language for visiting a cafeteria. The children learnt ten foods and ten drinks and how to order these.

In PE, we have been learning defensive skills for hockey. We learnt how to perform a block tackle successfully. We have had assessment week this and the children have worked incredibly hard. They should all be proud of themselves.

#### Year 5/6 - (Golden Eagle)

Golden Eagle class have continued to work hard over the last couple of weeks in class. We have been particularly impressed with them during our assessment week and proud of the perseverance they all showed in some tricky tests.

During Literacy, we have finished our explanation texts on Wallace and his cracking contraptions and have spent this week looking at our new unit of work on newspaper reports. The children have looked at the features of these texts and have enjoyed looking at our writing stimulus which is the Titanium video.

Maths lessons have seen us continue to revise key concepts needed for the upcoming Sats. We have revisited fractions and begun to look at decimal and fraction equivalence. During RE we have thought about funerals and looked at examples of Bible readings used in Christian funerals. The children considered why these readings were used and how they would make the grieving families feel.

In Science we have continued to look at Light and we have been discovering how the eye works. We also took part in our live Science lesson on the farm to consolidate our understanding of evolution and inheritance.

Our Geography lessons have focused more on physical geography over the last couple of weeks and we have studied both rivers and mountains. The children have researched local rivers and mountains in the UK compared to the rivers and mountains in the Western USA. In PE we have continued to enjoy our rugby and gymnastic sessions.
